Betsi Cadwaladr (24 May 1789 – 17 July 1860), also known as Beti Cadwaladr and Betsi Davis, worked as a nurse in the Crimean War alongside Florence Nightingale, although their different social backgrounds were a source of constant disagreement. She was commonly known as Betsi Cadwaladr, but she is sometimes referred to as Beti Cadwaladr or Elizabeth Davis. Betsi Cadwaladr (the Betsi Cadwaladr Health Board in Wales is named after her) was a nurse in the Crimean War but, apart from the 'Autobiography' of 1857 and a few booklets for children, her life remains little known.
